

PRIVACY POLICY

This Privacy Policy applies to personal information collected by Freemasons Victoria ('FMV'), other than the personal information collected when individuals purchase products online or communicate through the FMV website. Refer to the *Website & E-store Privacy Policy* for information on FMV's policy on management of personal information received via the E-store and website.

This policy explains how and why personal information is collected, how it is used, and what controls individuals have over how this information is used.

Freemasons Victoria is committed to protecting and safeguarding the privacy, confidentiality and security of personal information and the need to comply with the Commonwealth Privacy Act and the 10 National Privacy Principles which set out the way in which organisations must deal with personal information.

Collection of Information

Some information provided by members, customers, contractors and other third parties might be considered private or personal. Without these details we would not be able to carry on our business and provide services to members. We will only collect such personal information if it is necessary for delivery of our services.

Freemasons Victoria collects information in a number of ways from individual persons in different situations. In particular, personal information is collected from people in the following situations by Freemasons Victoria:

- Members or prospective members who complete paper based or online membership
 applications or registrations of interest through the Freemasons Victoria website and
 members who complete registration forms to attend Freemasons Victoria functions are
 required to provide some personal information and contact details
- Applications to the Freemasons Foundation of Victoria from members or the surviving partner of a member are conducted through the Freemasons Foundation of Victoria, and not tracked, collected, or stored by Freemasons Victoria in any way
- Hirers of venues are required to provide contact and bank account details
- Suppliers of goods and services to Freemasons Victoria are required to provide contact and bank account details
- Prospective employees of Freemasons Victoria provide personal information for the purposes of obtaining employment within Freemasons Victoria
- If you contact Freemasons Victoria either by telephone, social media, mail or email, we may keep a record of that correspondence and may use this as required.

At or before the time the personal information is collected by us we will take reasonable steps to ensure that you are made aware that we are collecting personal information, the purpose for collecting this information, the type(s) of organisations (if any) to which we usually disclose this information, the legislation governing the collection and use of this information and your right to access this information.

We will take reasonable steps to make sure that the personal information collected, used or disclosed is accurate, complete and up-to-date.



Use of Information Collected and Disclosure of Personal Information to Others

We may use or disclose personal information held about an individual for the primary purpose for which it is collected, such as to keep members informed about the ongoing activities of the organisation and to assist us in improving our services or in assessing applications for membership and organisational improvement.

Information provided by you may be used by FMV in the following ways:

- To maintain your individual membership record and a comprehensive membership database
- To provide information to you to enable you to access the services and benefits available to you as a member of FMV
- To provide your information to Masonic charities that are associated with but not part of FMV
- To conduct research in order to identify and analyse the ongoing needs of Freemasons and their families, and to identify future potential members, services and benefits.

Information provided by you to FMV may be disclosed to the following bodies:

- All Lodges within this jurisdiction of which you are, or of which you have indicated that you
 wish to be a member
- Any other Lodge within this jurisdiction making enquiries about you
- Appointed and authorised members of Freemasons Victoria, such as District Coordinators or District Education Officers
- Other Grand Lodges and the governing bodies of other Masonic Orders operating within Australia
- Other Grand Lodges (or equivalent) and the governing bodies of other Masonic Orders operating outside Australia.

We may also use such information for a purpose related to the primary purpose of collection and where it would reasonably be expected by you that we would use the information in such a way. This information is only disclosed to persons outside our business in the circumstances set out in this policy or as otherwise notified to you at the time of collection of the information.

We are permitted to use or disclose personal information held about you:

- Where you have consented to the use or disclosure
- Where we reasonably believe that the use or disclosure is necessary to lessen or prevent a serious, immediate threat to someone's health or safety or the public's health or safety
- Where we reasonably suspect that unlawful activity has been, is being or may be engaged in and the use or disclosure is a necessary part of our investigation or in reporting the matter to the relevant authorities
- Where such use or disclosure is required under or authorised by law (for example, to comply with a subpoena, a warrant or other order of a court or legal process) or required to inform
- Where we reasonably believe that the use or disclosure is reasonably necessary for
 prevention, investigation, prosecution and punishment of crime, wrongdoings or Masonic
 offences or for other Masonic bodies about your membership for the preparation for
 proceedings before any court, tribunal or enforcement body.



We will not use or disclose personal information about an individual for a purpose (the secondary purpose) other than the primary purpose of collection unless the secondary purpose is related to the primary purpose of collection and the individual would reasonable expect the organisation to use or disclose the information for the secondary purpose or the individual has consented to the use or disclosure.

We will not use personal identification numbers that have been assigned to an individual by a governmental department or agency.

Unless specified herein we will not pass any of your personal information to any third party, other than members or agents of Freemasons Victoria, without the consent of the individual.

Your personal contact information will never be given, sold, or otherwise shared by Freemasons Victoria with third parties for advertising or marketing purposes.

Links

Our web site may contain links to other web sites and those third party web sites may collect personal information about you. We are not responsible for the privacy practices of other businesses or the content of web sites that are linked to our web site. Freemasons Victoria encourages users to be aware when they leave the site and to read the privacy statements of each and every web site that collects personally identifiable information.

Security and Storage

Freemasons Victoria places a great importance on the security of all information associated with our members and contractors. We have implemented technology safeguards, security policies and other measures to protect data under our control from unauthorised access, improper use, alteration, unlawful or accidental destruction or accidental loss. We also protect your information by requiring that all our employees and others who have access to or are associated with the processing of your data to respect your confidentiality.

Personal information is de-identified or destroyed securely when no longer required by us.

Freemasons Victoria retains the information you provide to us including your contact and bank account details to enable us to verify transactions and customer details and to retain adequate records for legal and accounting purposes. This information is held on secure servers in controlled facilities.

Information stored within our computer systems can only be accessed by those entrusted with authority and computer network password sanctions.

You should keep in mind that whenever you voluntarily disclose personal information online, for example, through email, that information may in some circumstances be collected and used by others. If you post personal information online that is accessible to the public, you may receive unsolicited messages from other parties in return.

Access to and Correction of Personal Information

Freemasons Victoria is committed to maintaining accurate, timely, relevant and appropriate information about our members and customers.

So long as your request for your personal information is in accordance with the National Privacy Principles, then we will give you access to that information.



Inaccurate information will be corrected upon receiving advice to this effect from you once your identity has been confirmed. To ensure confidentiality, details of your personal information will be passed on to you only if we are satisfied that the information relates to you.

If we refuse to provide you with access or correct the personal information held about you by us then we will provide reasons for such refusal.

We will investigate your complaint and attempt to resolve any breach that might have occurred in relation to the collection, use or destruction of personal information held by us about you in accordance with the Commonwealth Privacy legislation. If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this procedure then you may request that an independent person (usually the Commonwealth Privacy Officer) investigate your complaint.
